

We are in the moments of transition on pathways of grace:

moving from pandemic to living with Coronavirus Disease moving from interim to settled pastor moving from winter to spring moving from Lent to Easter

What do we make of these pathways and how do we find our way? The answers will resonate differently to each of us. Pastorally speaking, I have enjoyed the season of Lent as we have dwelled on the Passion narratives in Sunday school, as we have engaged in rich conversations focused to indigenous neighbors, namely the Lummi and Nooksack native tribes, and as we have moved through John's gospel stories: Nicodemus at night; the Samaritan woman at the well; the blind man whose sight is restored; and the raising of Lazarus along with the First Testament story of Ezekiel in the midst of dry bones. Lent has opened pathways as change is on the horizon.

God's directive is always before us as our stories unfold in life's ebb and flow. Pathways connect and transition us from time and place, from season to season. Someday we will grasp how to live with Covid-19. Soon we will know the discernment to call. Once again I will return to retirement. By the time you read this article, spring will have arrived. Lent will lend itself to Holy Week and Easter will emerge. From his book, Tides and Seasons,

Our Tech Team remains ever hopeful that the system will provide a space for both our remote and in person congregation to share a worshipful experience. Through a series of brainstorming and exploratory sessions, several solutions have come to light.

- We have 1 computer to make and show the slides with the order of worship, words to prayers, and lyrics for music.
- The second computer helps us use a streaming service that can connect people outside our building with the worship service. In the past we recorded and posted the service for later viewing. (We would like to have this option in place as well.)
- The third device has been used to host a Zoom session for people to view our service from outside our building.

We are currently working toward moving our equipment into cabinets (for safety, security and convenience reasons) to the east side of the sanctuary. We are consulting with DataLink West (Eric Johnson) to make this move. This move will make the system fully functional.

We are looking into the possibility of using an alternative streaming service like Facebook or YouTube, both of which are being used by other Disciples and other houses of worship in our neighborhood.

We are deeply appreciative of the congregation's patience and support as we figure out all the details to make this an alternative way to worship. We ask that you continue adding this situation to your prayers and watch for updates in the near future.
